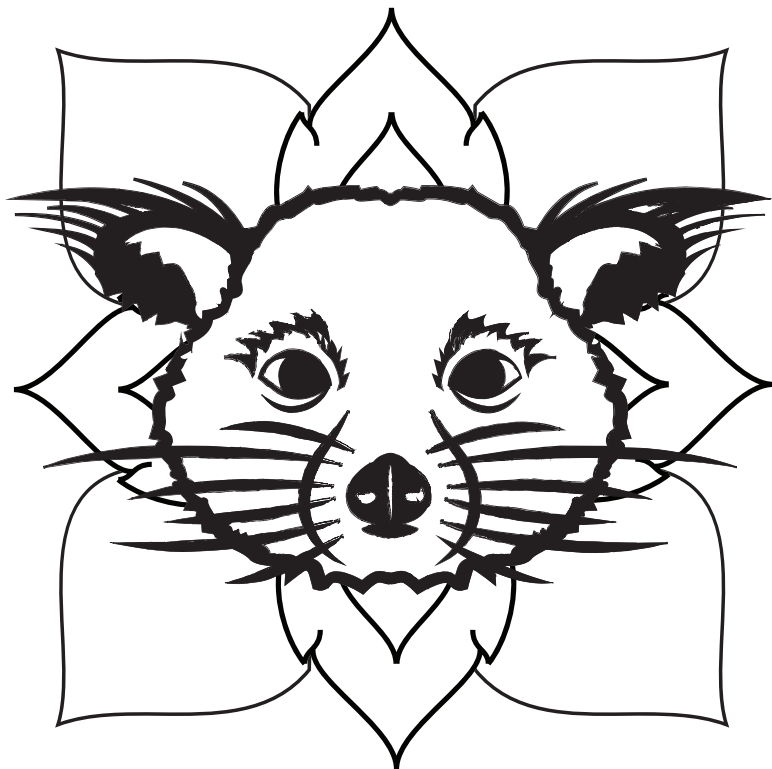
Malayan Tiger

Binturong

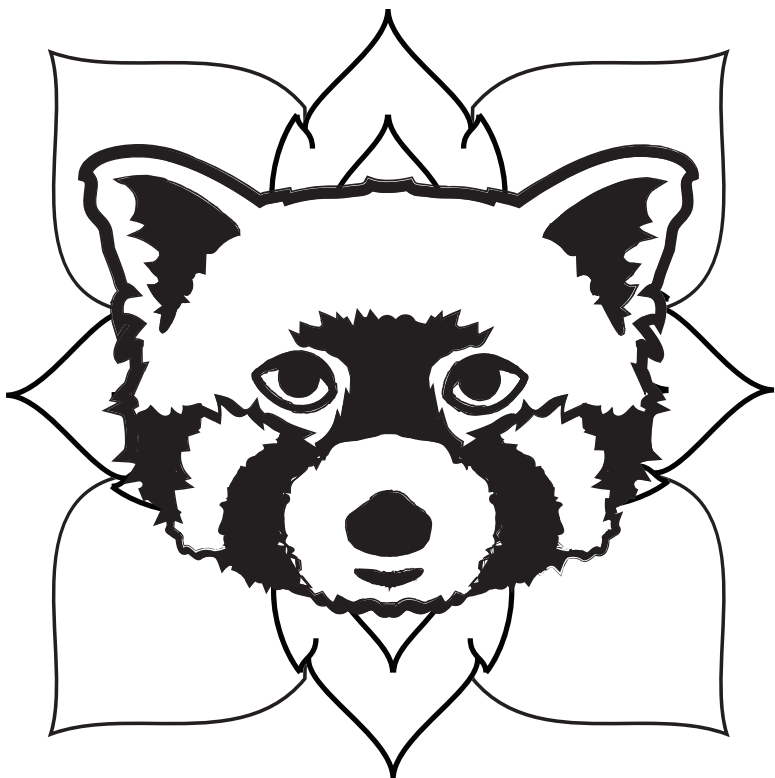


Binturongs smell like buttered popcorn.

Snow Leopard



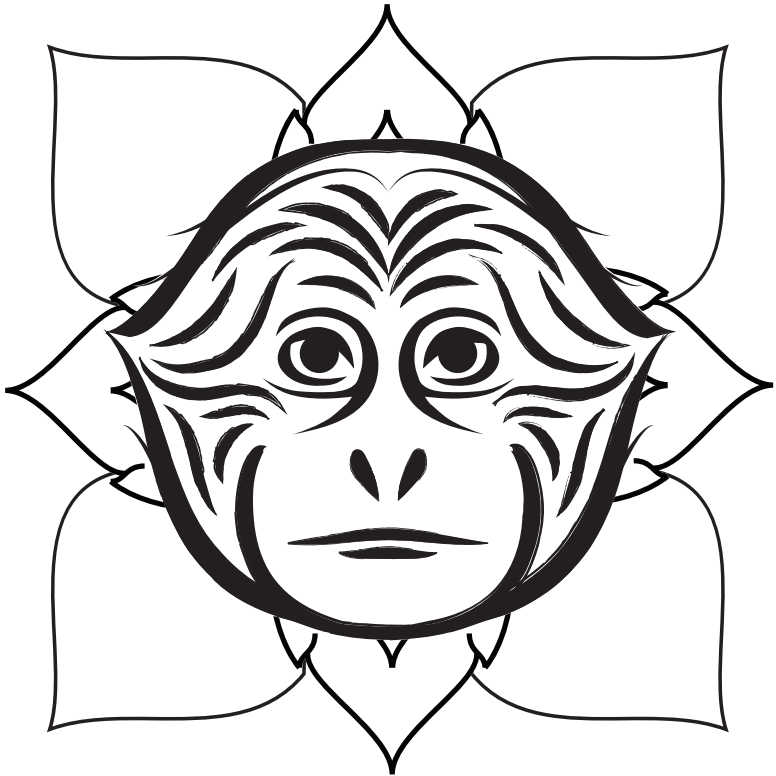
It's so fluffy! Snow Leopards are built for winter. Their paws are furred with hair between toes and they have long tails they can use like a scarf.
