


Paper Elephant

Audience

Designed for ages 5-12 years old.

Materials Needed

- Scrapbooking Paper or Large Square Piece of Paper
- Construction Paper
- Straw
- Scissors
- Glue
- Crayon and/or Markers (Optional)




Length of Activity

30 minutes


Procedure

- 1. Take your square piece of paper and fold it in half to make a triangle. Open the fold and cut on the fold like you created to make two triangle pieces of paper.
- 2. Fold one corner of the triangle inward so it points to the long side of the triangle. Repeat on the second piece of paper.



3. Cut a long strip of paper, about 2 inches wide from a long piece of paper. This will be the trunk of your elephant.

- 4. Glue down the triangle flap on one of the pieces of paper and then glue the trunk on top of the flap.
- 5. Next, put a line of glue from the top of the trunk to the long side of the triangle and put your straw on top. Make sure your straw sticks over a little on the long side of the triangle and a little onto the trunk.



- 6. Take your second large triangle and glue over the first, sandwiching the straw between the pieces of paper. Flip over.
- 7. Fold down and glue the points of the triangles to create ears.
- 8. Cut eyes and tusks out of construction paper and glue on. Add any decorations at this time.
- 9. Flip over and roll trunk up using a pencil and then you are finished!



10. Blow on your straw to make the trunk move!
