Tulsa Zoo partners with the Cikananga Conservation Breeding Centre (CCBC), which has the goal of breeding endemic Indonesian species that are threatened with extinction. The ultimate aim is to release individuals back into available safe habitats in their geographic range. This unfortunately is as a long-term goal with the rate of habitat destruction in Indonesia increasing.

Currently, CCBC houses and successfully breeds the Black-winged Myna (*Acridotheres melanopterus*), the Rufous-fronted Laughingthrush (*Garrulax rufifrons*), the Javan Green Magpie (*Cissa thalassina*), the Sumatran Laughingthrush (*Garrulax bicolor*) and the Javan Warty Pig (*Sus verrucosus*).

TULSA ZOO'S FOCUS: VETERINARIAN FIELD STATION AND ASIAN SONGBIRD BREEDING AND RELEASE PROGRAM

- The immediate goal of the program is focused on developing a genetically managed breeding program and then eventually releasing individuals back into available safe habitats in their geographic range. With Tulsa Zoo's support, CCBC has become a leader in breeding these species; contributing greatly to the known global populations. The release goal will take time and is a long-term goal due to the unprecedented rate of habitat loss within Indonesia. Because of the rapid habitat loss creating a captive population and satellite populations, it is recognized by the CCBC as being a major priority before species are lost to extinction.
